The Board convened pursuant to par 2, Sn 103, Headquarters, 7887 Graves Registration Detachment, APO 757, US Army, 29 August 1950, at Liege, Belgium on 1st Sept 1950. The purpose of the Board was to determine the non-recoverability status of certain casualties now under jurisdiction of this command.

The Board reviewed report of investigation, statements of witness and other papers, contained in the files of 7887 Graves Registration Detachment, EA, pertaining to the case of the following named casualty/casualties, the remains of which have not been recovered. 1. It is recommended that the Board take action on the following cases:

SYNOPSIS: The casualties listed on attached roster are reported by official records as Missing In Action or Killed In Action during ground air or naval operations in the department of Manche, France, from the period of 5 June 1944 to 15 August 1944. Extensive area searches as well as individual investigations have to date failed to furnish information as to the ultimate disposition of their remains. Efforts to effect association with unidentified recoveries from the area, now interred in U.S. Military Cemeteries, have also proven negative. The lack of specific information regarding the death or burial, limited search in most instances to general localities, however, documents on file in this Office and Office of The Quartermaster General substantiate the fact that numerous investigations covering the entire department of the Manche, have been conducted in the course of search operations for all losses, both recovered and unrecovered. The terrain of the Manche department, for the most part, consists of farm and pasture land which has been under constant cultivation and daily use since the cessation of hostilities, thus the possibility of undiscovered graves is remote. It can therefore only be concluded that the remains of the deceased in question were reduced by battle action to a state which precludes recovery or identification. The absence of specific information concerning their deaths, the failure of Field Investigations to provide evidence, and the lack of association with recovered unknowns would tend to substantiate these

conclusions. It is recommended that the remains of the individuals listed in these Board Proceedings be considered Non-Recoverable under the provisions of paragraph 3b, Letter, Office of The Quartermaster General, file QMGP 293, Subject: Processing Board Findings of Non-Recoverability Return of World War II Dead Program, dated 25 March 1949.

Reference is made to: OQMG Forms 371; After Action Reports, and Casualty Clearance Plan, concerning each decedent; Reports of Field Investigations previously forwarded to The Office of The Quartermaster General, pertaining to resolved casualties who were killed in action in the department of Manche, France: On file in the Office of The Quartermaster General, Washington, D. C.

2. It is recommended that the remains, based upon the above information and research, be declared non-recoverable.

MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD

SUBJECT: Review of Circumstances Surrounding the Disappearance of
Private Edgar J. Ashenfelter, 35614631, Infantry

1. Private Edgar J. Ashenfelter, 35614631, Infantry, was reported slightly wounded in action 7 June 1944, in France, not on flying or jump status, by Casualty Shipment No. 107, ETO, which status was later changed to missing in action on the same date by Casualty Shipment No. 263, ETO. He was presumed dead as of 8 June 1945, under the provisions of Section 6, Missing Persons Act.

2. Private Ashenfelter departed England at approximately 0630 hours, 7 June 1944, on a mission to Normandie, France. Brief resume of circumstances surrounding disappearance, dated 21 April 1945, and signed by Neal A. Vick, First Lieutenant Infantry, is quoted below:

"Private Ashenfelter loaded on his assigned glider at approx. 0630, 7 June 1944. His glider made a crash landing in Normandie at approx. 1100. Pvt Ashenfelter hasn't been seen since then by any man with his organization."

(1) First Warmer Indorsement, dated 4 January 1945, from Headquarters, 325th Glider Infantry U.S. Army to ETOUSA, filed in Private Ashenfelter's AG 201 file, contains the following information:

"* * * Soldier was reported as slightly injured in action, 7 June 1944, and Battle Casualty Report submitted on 18 June 1944, by this Headquarters. Soldier's status was changed to missing in action 7 June 1944, per letter XVIII Corp A/B, dated 23 Dec 1944."

3. An examination of the index in Prisoner of War Information Bureau, PMGQ, does not reveal any further information relevant to this review. The Captured German Records fail to reveal the name of Private Ashenfelter. The Quartermaster General's Office (Mrs. McConeghy) reports that there is no burial report of record in that office, nor are there any favorable Unknowns that might be associated with him.

The records concerning Pvt. Ashenfelter show that his Organization departed England for Normandie, France 7 June 1944 and he became MIA during the following incident:

At 0700 hrs., the Gliders began landing over an area some 2500 yards South East of "STE. MERÉ EGLISE"(349964)coord, France and extending towards the region East of "BLOSOVILLE"(369921)coord, France. The fields available for landing proved to be smaller than anticipated and the hedges and trees around them much higher than expected. There were many crash landings and some opposition from small arms fire. Mortar shells were also dropping in the landing areas.

He was listed as Missing in action as the 7 June 1944 and now he has been declared dead as of the 8 June 1945.

This information was compiled from the Historical Report on the Organization given on the attached report.

Later on, American officers came and had the graves opened in order to make sure that the graves had completely been emptied.

All the isolated graves located in the commune have been disinterred and to the best of my knowledge, I presently do not know anyone on the communal territory.

I, the undersigned, Renouf, farmer at St Martin de Varreville, at the "Megieres", state that I was requisitioned on Friday, 9 June to go with several other workers, in a parcel situated near the hamlet of St Martin, in order to dig graves and bury the numerous bodies which were brought there by truck. I worked that day and the following day.

Those bodies were all laid against one of the hedgerows in the fields, in eight or ten rows, and there, a group of American soldiers and officers checked on the bodies and took notes, probably on their identities. Our work consisted of the digging of the graves and of putting the deceased bodies which were brought wrapped in paracordage or cotton sheets, and we could see the persons we were burying. To my knowledge there has never been a book or report regarding these deceased at the townhall of St Martin de Varreville.




