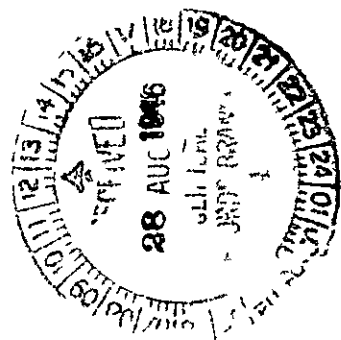

I regret to inform you that an investigation has been made, and information received reveals that the remains of your son were buried at sea. It is with deep regret that you must be advised that owing to the stress of war, it was impossible to transport your son's remains to land for interment. The body was carefully prepared and appropriate services conducted, before his remains were committed to the sea.

It is sincerely hoped that the above information will not add to your distress and that you will remember that everything humanly possible is done to care for our honored dead in the most reverent and dignified manner.
