Proceeding of a Board of Officers appointed in accordance with letter AGAN-S 293.9 (27 Mar 47) D-M, War Dept, TAGN, 9 April 1947.

The Board convened pursuant to par 2, So 108, Headquarters, 7887 Graves Registration Detachment, APO 757, US Army, 29 August 1950, of Thege, Belgium on 1 SFPT 1950. The purpose of the Board was to determine the non-recoverability status of certain casualties now under jurisdiction of this command.

The Brand reviewed report of investigation, statements of witness and other papers, contained in the files of 7887 Graves Registration Detachment, EA, pertaining to the case of the following named casualty/casualties, the remains of which have not been recovered. SYNOPSIS: The casualties listed on attached roster are reported by official records as Missing In Action or Killed In Action during groun air or naval operations in the department of Manche, France, from the period of 5 June 1944 to 15 August 1944. Extensive area searches as well as individual investigations have to date failed to furnish information as to the ultimate disposition of their remains. Efforts to effect association with unidentified recoveries from the area, now interred in U.S. Military Cemeteries, have also proven negative. The lack of specifi information regarding the death or burial, limited search in most instances to general localities, however, documents on file in this Offic and Office of The Quartermaster General substantiate the fact that numerous investigations covering the entire department of the Manche, have been conducted in the course of search operations for all losses, both recovered and unrecovered. The terrain of the Manche department, for the most part, consists of farm and pasture land which has been under constant cultivation and daily use since the cessation of hostilities, thus the possibility of undiscovered graves is remote. It can therefore only be concluded that the remains of the deceased in question were reduced by battle action to a state which precludes recovery or identification. The absence of specific information concerning their deaths, the failure of Field Investigations to provide evidence, and the lack of association with recovered unknowns would tend to substantiate these

conclusions. It is recommended that the remains of the individuals listed in these Board Proceedings be considered Non-Recoverable under the provisions of paragraph 3b, Letter, Office of The Quartermaster General, file QMGMP 293, Subject: Processing Board Findings of Norm-Recoverability Return of World War II Dead Program, dated 25 March 1949.

Reference is made to: OQMG Forms 371; After Action Reports, and Casualty Clearance Plan, concerning each decedent; Reports of Field Investigations previously forwarded to The Office of The Quartermaster General, pertaining to resolved casualties who were killed in action in the department of Manche, France: On file in the Office of The Quartermaster General, Mashington, D. 2. It is recommended that the remains, based upon the above information and research, be declared non-recoverable.

MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD:

SUBJECT: Review of Circumstances Surrounding the Disappearance of Enlisted Personnel Presumed Dead.

1. The following named enlisted personnel of 359th Infantry Regiment were initially reported as Casualties on 6 June 1944, in France, not on flying or jump status, by Casualty Shipment No. 096 ETO, and their status was subsequently changed to missing in action on the same date. They were presumed dead as of 7 June 1945, under the provisions of Section 5, Missing Persons Act:

Pfc	James T. Hoke	38094200
Pfc	William L. Langston	18086596
Pfc	Raymond C. Sanders	37107418

- 2. On 29 March 1945, a communication AGPC-S 704 (29 Mar 45) was dispatched to the European Theater of Operations requesting that circum tances forming the basis of change of status in the cases of Hoke and Langston be submitted to this office. The Fourth Indorsement added to the basic communication on 11 March 1945 at Headquarters, 359th Infantry Regiment shows that both of these soldiers were reported slightly wounded in action on 6 June 1944 by their respective companies and that no further information had been received concerning their status with the exception of status cards received from the Third United States Army changing their status to missing in action as of 6 June 1944. The Eighth Indorsement, dated 16 April 1945, also added to Headquarters, 359th Infantry Regiment, reads, in part, as follows:
 - "1. Pfc. James T. Hoke, 38094200, Company 'M', 359th Infantry was reported LWA 6 June 1944 to us by Captain James K. Kellond, no longer a member of this organization.
 - "2. Pfc. William L. Langston, 18086596, Company 'A; 359th Infantry was reported LWA 6 June 1944 to us by Captain Robert C. Couch, Jr., no longer a member of this organization.
 - "3. First and Third Battalions were attached to 4th Infantry Division on D-Day the 6th of June 1944. Pfc Hoke. Pfc Langston being a member of A' Company was in First Battalion. Company 'A' arrived at 061815 and Company 'M' arrived at 062330. Both Battalions landed on Utah Red Beach (east coast of Cherbourg Peninsula).

- "4. Admission and Disposition Sheets were prepared by the 4th Infantry Division, but due to the battalion conditions on D-Day much of the casualty information was no on Admission and Disposition Reports, but rather on certificates from companies concerned. Reports were made adcordingly by this Headquarters when any such casualty information reached us if source could be considered reliable and insure accuracy.
 - "5. Further information consists of the following:
- "a. LWA status on each of the two men was reported to us on certificates signed by Officers mentioned in paragraphs 1 & 2 above. The casualties occurred in the beach area.
- "b. It is not known by us whether either of the two men arrived at the aid station. However, they were left behind to be taken care of my medics coming from the rear.
- "C. Tactical situation was one of heavy, but scattered opposition. There was much artillery and motor fire. Enemy snipers were active throughout the area, a large part of which was flooded swamp. There was occasional straffing and bombing. Areas were covered with mines. Our troops were mopping up as they went along and making a reconnaissance in force as a reserve to the 4th Infantry Division. There was a possibility of capture by enemy patrols or the subject enlisted men could have been hit again by the artillery and motor fire while awaiting further aid. We have no evidence, of course, of either of these possibilities, but it is known that in at least one similar case on LWA later was found buried on the beach."
- 3. A communication, AGPC-S 201 Sanders, Raymond C. (19 Apr 45). was dispatched to the European Theater of Operations on 19 April 1945, for additional information concerning the disappearance of Private First Class Sanders. A request for the disposition made for this soldier's Service Record was also included in the communication. The communication was returned to this office from Headquarters, ETOUSA by Seventh Indorsement, dated 24 May 1945, which shows that soldier's Service Record was forwarded to The Adjutant General's Office on 5 March 1945. The Fourth Indorsement which had been added to the basic communication under date of 5 May 1945 at Headquarters, 359th Infantry Regiment, indicates that Sanders was reported seriously wounded in action on 6 June 1944 by First Lieutenant

August D. Parker, who was killed in action on 9 June 1944. Other information contained in the indorsement is substantially the same as that set forth in the preceding subparagraph concerning the disappearance of Privates Hoke and Langston.

- 4. An examination of the index in Prisoner of War Information Bureau, FMGO, does not reveal any further information relevant to this review. The Captured German Records, now of record in this office, does not reveal the names of subject enlisted men. The Quartermaster General's Office, Memorial Division (Mrs. McConaughy) reports there are no burial reports of record in that office, nor are there any favorable Unknowns to be associated with this case.
- 5. In the absence of any definite information as to the fate of subject enlisted men after they were wounded in action, it is concluded that the information of record in the Department, as this time, does not warrant the issuance of official reports of death under the provisions of Section 9, Missing Persons Act.

Dear Mr. and Mrs. Hoke:

Since your son, Private First Class JamesT. Hoke, 38,094,200, Infantry, was reported missing in action 6 June 1944, the War Department has entertained the hope that he survived and that information would be revealed dispelling the uncertainty surrounding his absence. However, as in many cases, the conditions of warfare deny us such information. The record concerning your son shows that he was wounded while participating in the invasion of northern France, but that he was not seen or heard from thereafter.

Full consideration has recently been given to all available information bearing on the absence of your son, including all records, reports and circumstances. These have been carefully reviewed and considered. In view of the fact that twelve months have now expired without the receipt of evidence to support a continued presumption of survival, the War Department must terminate such absence by a presumptive finding of death. Accordingly, an official finding of death has been recorded under the provisions of Public Law 490, 77th Congress, approved March 7, 1942, as amended.

The finding does not establish an actual or probable date of death; however, as required by law it includes a presumptive date of death for the termination of pay and allowances, settlement of accounts and payment of death gratuities. In the case of your son this date has been set as 7 June 1945, the day following the expiration of twelve months: absence.

I regret the necessity for this message but trust that the ending of a long period of uncertainty may give at least some small measure of consolation. I hope you may find sustaining comfort in the thought that the uncertainty with which war has surrounded the absence of your son has enhanced the honor of his service to his country and of his sacrifice.



Dear Mrs. Hoke:

I have received your letter of 16 July 1945, in which you request information concerning your son, the late Private First Class James T. Hoke.

I fully appreciate your desire to know all the circumstances surrounding your son's death and regret that so much sorrown has come to you. The records of the War Department disclose that Private Hoke was a member of an Infantry Division which participated in landing operations on 6 June 1944. At the time, the company of which your son was a member, landed on the east coast of the Cherbourg Peninsula. The tactical situation was one of heavy but scattered opposition and there was much artillery and mortar fire. Enemy snipers were active throughout the area, of which a large part was flooded swamp and there was occasional strafing and bombing. Your son was wounded in this engagement and when progress reports regarding his physical condition were not received, humerous inquiries were made by this office. As you were advised in the telegram of 9 December 1944, a report was received from the Commanding General of the European Theater of Operations which stated that your son, who was previously reported slightly wounded in action, was reported missing in action since 6 June 1944. As you were previously informed, your son's case was reviewed in accordance with the provisions of Public Law 490, 77th Congress, as amended, which resulted in an official finding of death, showing 7 June 1945, as the presumed date of death. Bases on the experience of the War Department, it is reasonably certain that if Private Hoke were alive, he would have been so reported before twelve months' absence had elapsed.

No further information is available in this office regarding your son and there is no evidence in the War Department to substantiate the unofficial report received that your son was on a hospital ship when he became missing in action. You may be assured that our overseas authorities are constantly doing their utmost to secure information regarding

our missing personnel, including those in whose cases presumptive findings of death were made. Captured enemy reports are being carefully examined and verified and details are obtained from men who were reported missing, but have returned to military control, reports have been received which indicate recovery of the remains of many men who were originally recorded as missing in action for a period of twelve months and whose status it was later necessary to change to a finding of death in accordance with the provisions of the above cited law. If any additional message pertaining to your son is received, you will be immediately notified.

I am sorry that the conditions of warfare have denied to some families complete knowledge of the circumstances attending the death of their loved ones, but it is my hope that satisfying information concerning your son will eventually become available. Your loss is great I know, and my heartfelt sympathy is with you in your sorrow.

MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD:

SUBJECT: Review of Circumstances Surrounding the Disappearance of Enlisted Personnel Presumed Dead.

1. The following named enlisted personnel of the 359th Infantry Regiment were initially reported as casualties on 6 June 1944, in France, not on flying or jump status, by Casualty Shipment No. 096 ETO, and their status was subsequently changed to missing in action on the same date. They were presumed dead as of 7 June 1945, under the provisions of Section 5, Missing Persons Act:

Pfc William L. Langston 18086596
Pfc Raymond C. Sanders 37107418

- 2. On 29 March 1945, a communication, AGPC-S 704 (29 Mar 45) was dispatched to the European Theater of Operations requesting that circumstances forming the basis of change of status in the cases of Hoke and Langston be submitted to this office. The Fourth Indorsement added to the basic communication on 11 March 1945 at Headquarters, 359th Infantry Regiment shows that both of these soldiers were reported slightly wounded in action on 6 June 1944 by their respective companies and that no further information had been received concerning their status with the exception of status cards received from the Third United States Army changing their status to missing in action as of 6 June 1944. The Eighth Indorsement, dated 16 April 1945, also added to Headquarters, 359th Infantry Regiment, reads, in part, as follows:
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 - "3. First and Third Battalions were attached to 4th Infantry Division on D-Day the 6th of June 1944. Pfc. Hoke, Pfc Langston being a member of 'A' Company was in First Pattalion. Company 'A' arrived at 061815 and Company 'M' arrived at 062330. Both Battalions landed on Utah Red Beach (east coast of Cherbourg Peninsula).

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- "a. LWA status on each of the two men was reported to us on certificates signed by Officers mentioned in paragraphs 1 & 2 above. The casualties occurred in the beach area.
- men arrived at the aid station. However, they were left behind to be taken care of by medics coming in from the rear.
- opposition. There was much artillery and motor fire. Enemy snipers were active throughout the area, a large part of which was flooded swamp. There was occasional straffing and bombing. Areas were covered with mines. Our troops were mopping up as they went along and making a reconnaissance in force as a reserve to the 4th Infantry Division. There was a possibility of capture by enemy patrols or the subject enlisted men could have been hit again by the artillery and motor fire while awaiting further aid. We have no evidence, of course, of either of these possibilities, but it is known that in at least one similar case on LWA later was found buried on the beach."
- 3. A communication, AGPC-S 201 Sanders, Raymond C. (19 Apr 45), was dispatched to the European Theater of Operations on 19 April 1945, for additional information concerning the disappearance of Frivate First Class Sanders. A request for disposition made for this soldier's Service Record was also included in the communication. The communication was returned to this office from Headquarters, ETOUSA by Seventh Indersement, dated 24 May 1945, which shows that soldier's Service Record was forwarded to The Adjutant General's Office on 5 March 1945. The Fourth Indersement which had been added to the basic communication under date of 5 May 1945 at Headquarters, 359th Infantry Regiment, indicates that Sanders was reported seriously wounded in action on 6 June 1944 by First Lieutenant

August D. Parker, who was killed in action on 9 June 1944. Other information contained in the indorsement is substantially the same as that set forth in the preceding subparagraph concerning the disappearance of Privates Hoke and Langston.

- 4. An examination of the index in Prisoner of War Information Bureau, PMGO, does not reveal any further information relevant to this review. The Captured German Records, now of record in this office, does not reveal the names of subject enlisted men. The Quartermaster General's Office, Memorial Division (Mrs. McConaughy) reports there are no burial reports of record in that office. nor are there any favorable Unknowns to be associated with this case.
- 5. In the absence of any definite information as to the fate of subject enlisted men after they were wounded in action, it is concluded that the information of record in the Department, as this time, does not warrant the issuance of official reports of death under the provisions of Section 9, Missing Persons Act.
