



To date, no property of Sergeant Carriker has been received at this Bureau, nor indication that any has been sent here. Since Sergeant Carriker was an infantryman, likely he carried all his possessions on his person.

I have, today, sent a tracer letter overseas, in the endeavor to learn whether any of his property was recovered. Upon receipt of reply, you will be informed the result of our investigation.

I appreciate your interest in this case and am glad to be of service.


