It is regretted that the items about which you incuire were not received here. All the property belonging to your son reseived at this Bureau has been sent to you.

So that you may better understand the difficulties encountered in the recovery of personal effects, I am inclosing an information circular on the subject.

For reply to any questions pertaining to pay which might be due Lieutenant Farnham, I suggest you direct an inquiry to the General Accounting Office, Claims Division, 5th Street & Judiciary Square, Washington 25, D. C.

I wish to assure you that in the event additional property belonging to your son is received here at a later date, you will be notified promptly.

Receipt is acknowledged of your letter of 2 November 1944 requesting information pertaining to your son, the late First Lieutenant Elmer F. Farnham.

At the outbreak of the war it became necessary to adopt the policy that the remains of our deceased military personnel outside the United States will be interred locally and none returned to this country until after the war. A notation has been made on the official records of this office that it is your desire to have your son's body returned, if possible, to the United States for final interment after the war. At the proper time the legal next of kin will be requested to advise this office of the desired place of final shipment. Steps will be taken at that time to prepare and ship the remains at Government expense to the place thus designated, and a Government headstone will be furnished for the grave.

At the present time there is no authority whereby the Government can pay for a private cemetery lot. However, when the remains are returned to the United States for final interment, there will be a certain amount allowed by the Government for interment expense.

The Adjutant General has authority over information pertaining to the Purple Heart. Therefore, a copy of your letter has been forwarded to that office for reply to you concerning this subject.

With reference to your inquiry regarding a pension, a copy of your letter has also been forwarded to the Administrator of Veterans Affairs, Washington 25, D. C., which office will furnish you with the information you desire.

I wish to extend to you my sincere sympathy in the loss of your son.

Reference is made to your letter in which you request information concerning your son, the late First Lieutenant Elmer F. Fernham.

Now that Japan has been defeated immediate plans are being formulated with a view to returning to the next of kin the remains of their loved ones. This sacred duty will be carried out by the Government at its expense and insofar as practicable in accordance with the expressed wishes of the legal next of kin, who will be notified by this office well in advance of the actual return of the remains. The mission as a whole is world wide in scope and of necessity time consuming, but you may rest assured that this office fully appreciates your desires and will do everything in its power to fulfill them at the earliest possible date.

There are no provisions whereby the Mar Department can furnish photographs of indifidual graves of deceased military personnel outside the United States. Therefore it is not possible to comply with your request.

A copy of your letter has been forwarded to The Adjutant General's Office, Washington 25, D. C., for reply to your request as to the circumstances surrounding the death of your son.

The Quartermaster General of the Army has been entrusted with this sacred responsibility to the honored dead. The records of the War Department indicate that you may be the nearest relative of the above-named deceased, who gave his life in the service of his country.

The enclosed pamphlets, "Disposition of World War II Armed Forces Dead," and "American Cemeteries," explain the disposition, options and services made evailable to you by your Government. If you are the next of kin according to the line of kinship as set forth in the enclosed pamphlet, "Disposition of World War II Armed Forces Dead," you are invited to express your Wishes as to the disposition of the remains of the deceased by completing Part I of the enclosed form "Request for Disposition of Remains." Should you desire to relinquish your rights to the next in line of kinship, please complete Part III of the enclosed form. If you are not the next of kin, please complete Part III of the enclosed form.

If you should elect Option 2, it is advised that no funeral arrangements or other personal arrangements be made until you are further notified by this office.

Will you please complete the enclosed form, "Request for Disposition of Remains" and mail in the enclosed self-addressed envelope, which requires no postage, within 30 days after its receipt by you? Its prompt return will avoid unnecessary delays.

In reviewing your son's file in our office, there is nothing that would contradict identification by means of identification tags. It was further substantiated by items of personal effects which were removed from his body.

Once identity of the remains is definitely and positively established, evidence of identity is buried with the remains and indicated on the grave marker. If removal and reburial elsewhere become necessary, all records are again examined and all evidence of identity reviewed. Military personnel especially trained in the procedure supervise and directly control these operations. Military escorts provide constant protection from the time of exhumation of the remains until they are received by the next of


You may rest assured that the remains identified as those of your son were delivered to you by the Distribution Center nearest your home.

Your letter to The Adjutant General's Office, concerning your son, the late First Lieutenant Elmer F. Farnham, has been referred to this office.

The Department of the Army employs every possible means to establish the identification of the deceased members of the Armed Forces, definitely and positively.

Identification tags found on the remains of our deceased personnel are considered as a positive means of identification provided contradictory evidence is not found on the remains which would tend to indicate that the tags did not belong to the individual concerned. In order to eliminate the possibility of an error, our Graves Registration personnel in the field search every individual's body for personal effects, laundry marks on the clothing, clothing size, shoe size, and other media which would either substantiate or preclude the identification evidence provided by the tags. Because of this careful examination, approximately 60 to 70% of our known deceased personnel of World War II were identified by means of their identification tags which were found on the remains at the time they were recovered.

The Department of the Army regulations require that identification tags be issued to each member of the Armed Forces as soon ass possible after his entry into the service. These identification tags consist of the name and serial number of the individual concerned and are to be worn at all times. They may be removed temporarily only as the necessities of personal hygiene may require. To insure that this regulation is carried out, frequent inspections and spot checks are made. In instances where these tags are lost by the individual, a new set is procured as soon as possible in order that they may be constantly with the person concerned. They are at all times accepted for positive identification purposes of the Armed Forces Personnel.

I am sure you can readily understand that since such emphasis is placed by the Department of the Army on the identification tag in life, consequently the same emphasis is placed upon them in death.
