The headstone will be inscribed with the name exactly as recorded above, the rank or rating where appropriate, organization, State, and date of death. Any inquiries relative to the type of headstone or the spelling of the name to be inscribed thereon, should be addressed to the American Battle Monuments Commission, Washington 25, D. C. Your letter should include the full name, rank, serial number, grave location, and name of the cemetery.

While interments are in progress, the cemetery will not be open to visitors. You may rest assured that this final interment was conducted with fitting dignity and solemnity and that the grave-site will be carefully and conscientiously maintained in perpetuity by the United States Government.

Reference is made to your letter addressed to The Adjutant General, Washington, D. C., requesting additional information regarding the death of your son.

The casualty message submitted by the Commanding General of the European Theater of Operations stated only that your son, Technician Fifth Grade John F. McNally, Army serial number 13 152 616, Infantry, was killed in action in France on 7 June 1944, the same day he was previously reported missing. I regret that no further information regarding his death has been received but I am sure you will understand how extremely difficult it is under actual battle conditions to record all details concerning casualties.

With reference to your statement that you have received no word from overseas, this procedure of reporting casualties was not in effect at the time of your son's death.

The Quartermaster General of the Army, Washington 25, D. C., has jurisdiction over matters pertaining to the burial of our military personnel who die overseas. A copy of your letter has accordingly been forwarded to that officer for necessary action.
