CHANGE IN TABLE OF ORGANIZATION

The Parachute Table of Organization was strictly adhered to until the Table of Organization was changed by D Circular, T/O 7-31, dated 1 November 1944. No additional changes have been since that date.

ATTACHMENT OF 507^m PARACHUTE INFANTRY TO THIRD ARMY

The 507th Parachute Infantry was attached to Third Army from 6 March 1943 to 19 March 1943, during maneuvers in Louisiana.

ATTACHMENT OF 507^m PARACHUTE INFANTRY TO FIRST AIRBORNE BRIGADE

The 507th Parachute Infantry was attached to the First Airborne Brigade, commanded by Brigadier General Leo Donovan, 20 July 1943. Headquarters was at Fort Meade, South Dakota. The 507th Parachute Infantry, the 326th Glider Infantry, and the 88th Glider Infantry formed the nucleus of the Brigade. The 507th Parachute Infantry remained attached to the Brigade until just before it left for Camp Shanks, New York. The Brigade was disbanded shortly thereafter.

ATTACHMENT OF 507^m PARACHUTE INFANTRY TO 82^{NU} AIRBORNE DIVISION

The 507th Parachute Infantry was attached to the 82nd Airborne Division 17 March 1944, under authority from the Commanding General, European Theater of Operations, U.S. Army.

ASSIGNMENT OF 507^m PARACHUTE INFANTRY TO 17TH AIRBORNE DIVISION

The 507th Parachute Infantry Regiment was relieved from assignment to European Theater of Operation, U.S. Army and assigned to XVIII Corps (Airborne) and attached to the 17th Airborne Division, under authority of General Orders No. 2, Headquarters XVIII Corps (Airborne) dated 27 August 1944. The 507th Parachute Infantry Regiment was relieved from assignment to Headquarters XVIII Corps (Airborne) and attachment, and was assigned to the 17th Airborne Division, effective 1 March 1945, which assignment was concurrent with the reorganization of the 17th Airborne Division, as per troop Assignment No. 1, Headquarters XVIII Corps (Airborne) dated 26 February 1945.
