RECORD OF EVENTS

June 6: About 2 miles east of Ste Mere Eg-  
lise France - Btry left Camp Xembury England  
at about 1900 rode to airfield in trucks and  
loaded in Gliders ready to leave on mission.  
At 2037 Btry left airfield, flew to and  
landed in France behind enemy lines, weather:  
Fair Morale: Good. Distance covered in all,  
about 150 miles.

June 7: About 2 miles east of Ste Mere 3g-  
lise France - Btry spent most of day recover-  
ing equipment and evacuating wounded. At about  
1800 Btry was assembled with the Bn. Equip-  
ment not yet recovered: 3 Howitzers, 5 Jeeps  
(cont'd on the rear)

and 2 trailers. An all around defense was set up in area and the rest of day was spent at such needed rest. weather: fair Morale: Good.

June 8: About  $1\frac{1}{2}$  miles west of Ste Mere Ag-lise France - Btry took care of equipment and material most of the morning. At 1100 Btry started moving forward to front lines to gun position. Men and equipment was shuttled by jeeps. All was moved at about 1500. All Bn. guns was put under 1 Btry control and started firing at about 1800. Firing was continued up to 2400. Material on hand at present; 9 Jeeps and 4 Howitzers. weather: Slightly Inclimate Morale: Good. Distance covered in all,  $4\frac{1}{2}$  miles.

June 9: About  $1\frac{1}{2}$  miles west of Ste Mere Ag-lise France - Btry continued firing and at 1200 separated from rest of the Bn to operate as a Btry. Several heavy barrages were fired to support the infantry. weather: Inclimate Morale: Good.

June 10: Chef du Pont France - Btry stayed in position but never fired any throughout the day. Waiting for orders to move forward. The day was spent cleaning material and caring for personal needs. weather: Inclimate Morale: Good.
