

FORWARD BOMBING AND BOMBARD PARK AIRFIELD,
BERKSHIRE, ENGLAND.

6 June 1944. Btry left air field on take off at 2342 hrs comprising of 15 Horsa and 6 CG 4-A Gliders. Encountered enemy Ack-Ack and machine gun fire on French coast. All Gliders made scattered crash landings in and around Ste Mere Eglise, France, near enemy concentrations with great damage and heavy casualties. Btry fired upon by artillery and mortar fire. 1 Officer killed in action by enemy Anti-Tank Gun. ~~1~~ 3 EM Killed in Action, 1 EM Seriously injured in action, 6 EM Lightly injured in Action, as a result of crash landings of gliders. 1 EM Seriously wounded in Action & 2 EM Lightly wounded in Action from enemy fire. All injured and wounded hospitalized.

7 June 1944. Bn assembled for night and in morning Btry moved into position with one Gun under heavy artillery fire at 33.7-96.2 Map Sheet 31/18 NE Scale: 1/25000. One Gun obtained from Baker Btry and fired Approx 70 rounds on bridges and tanks. No casualties.

8 June 1944. Btry in same position and shelled by enemy artillery fire until 1200 hrs Re-assembled with four guns at 1600 hrs. Eleven (11) $\frac{1}{2}$ ton trucks recovered from crashed gliders during the day. Four (4) $\frac{1}{2}$ ton trucks attached to 505th Frcht Inf Regmt. Moral Excellent and no casualties. 1 EM Lightly injured in action 6 June 44 hospitalized.

9 June 1944. Sea-Borne element of 15 EM joined Btry bringing ammo and rations near Ste Mere Eglise, France. Btry fired 1328 rounds 105MM ammo on enemy infantry and artillery positions. Repaired one (1) 105MM Gun that was recovered from Glider wreckage bringing the total of Guns for Btry to five (5). No Casualties. Weather fair and moral excellent.
