11 Harlan Soldiers' Bodies Among Shipments Now Arriving

With the arrival of three U. S. Army transports, two from Europe and one from the South Pacific, the bodies of eleven Harlan County war dead will have returned to the United States.

Docking in San Francisco June 25 was the Army Transport Sergeant Morris E. Crain with 1,941 bodies among which were those of 50 Kentuckians. Included were the bodies of:

RM2c William H. Huddleston, Navy, with Mrs. Juanita E. Huddleston, Benham, listed as next of kin, and

Pfc. Edward Irvin, Army, with Mrs. Bertha Couch, Pine Mountain, listed as next of kin.

The bodies of two more Harlan Countians were among the 3,734 returned June 26 when the U. S. Army transport Greenville Victory docked at New York from the European Theater.

Included in the 151 Kentuckians' bodies were those of:

Pfc. Paul H. Jones, Army, with Moss M. Jones, Evarts, listed as next of kin, and

Pfc. Jack E. Laws, Army, with Mrs. Ruth Laws, Cawood, listed as next of kin.

Aboard the U. S. Transport Lawrence Victory, expected to arrive within a few days in New York from Europe, will be the

bodies of seven Harlan Countians, killed in that theater. Of the 5,374 bodies aboard, 125 are those of Kentuckians. The Harlan County bodies are those of:

S/Sgt. Walter H. Farnwall, Air Force, with Mrs. Carrie Fleenor, S. Main Street, Harlan, listed as next of kin,

COX General Jackson, Navy, with Mrs. Bertha Jackson, Baxter, listed as next of kin,

Cpl. Chad B. Lewis, Army, with Mrs. Artrice J. Lewis, Dayhoit, listed as next of kin,

1st Lt. Morris Saylor, Jr., Air Force, with Morris Saylor, Sr., Cumberland, Avenue, Harlan, listed as next of kin, and

Pvt. Charles E. Walker, Army, with Charles C. Walker, Loyall, listed as next of kin.
