RECORD OF EVENTS

CO "H"

- 11 June 44: Moved to isolated point and set up defense as Flank guard for 325 Inf.
- 12 June 44: In defensive position.
- 13 June 44: Moved to Division Reserve; remainder of Bn also here.
- 14 June 44: Committed to action, atchd to 32d Inf for attack with Tanks.
- 15 June 44: Still in Div Reserve. Going west, I think.
- 16 June 44: On outpost near Planure, France.
- 17 June 44: In position near Lature, France. American tanks shot up the 2nd Plt, 2 men wounded by Germans. The Germans lost 30 KIA & 20 Prisoners of War.
- 18 June 44: Co was in defensive position and is now on an alert status.
- 19 June 44: Moved by foot fr position of Planure, France to North edge of St Sauveur Le Vicome to entruck; stood by all day waiting for trucks. Entrucked at 2300 hour.
- 20 June 44: Detrucked at Etienville about 0130. Marched to bivouac area, arrived 0300. Marched to Bois de Limors, arrived about 2030 hr. No contact with enemy.
- 21 June 44: Attacked on right flank about 1730. 1st attack beaten off. Later enemy turned right flank, but were later pushed back. CO & several men wounded. Artillery and mortar fire most of day. Co CP had to move. mortar fire: Capt DeLong Came back to Co. Moved about 1500 yards to the east. 3 men wounded by booby trap shortly after arrival in new position.
- 22 June 44: In defensive position. Quiet most of day. Sgt Huges fr Co operations Sgt to Platoon Leader. Second platoon shelled by enemy artillery about 1630, 1 killed & 1 wounded. Lei, Bn runner & mail orderly, killed between Bn CP and Co CP Shell Fire. Held by Co B about 1930, moved about 2 miles to rear.
- 23 June 44: In reserve. Reorganizing & resting.
- 24 June 44: Constructed alternate defense position. Shell fire fell on 2nd & 3rd Platoons about 2100 hr. No Casualties. Explosion in Bn dump-T 5 Geiler Missing.
- 25 June 44: Changed positions with Co "G". Still in same Bn Defense Area.
