Body Of SHS Grad, Killed In Invasion, To Arrive Thursday

Body of Private First Class Kermit J. Hoffman, of Sunbury, R. D. 2, killed in France in the Normandy invasion in 1944, will arrive here from Philadelphia by train at 4:50 o'clock Thursday afternoon for burial.

Funeral services will be held from the Dornsife funeral home Saturday afternoon at 3:30 o'clock. Rev. Charles Snyder, Lutheran pastor, of Herndon, will officiate. Burial will be in Pomfret Manor Cemetery. Milton Jarrett Norman

Post 201, American Legion, will have full charge. A firing squad will fire three volleys over the grave and taps will be sounded.

The participation of the post will be after that in the funeral of Pfc. Harvey H. Osman, whose body arrived yesterday and whose funeral will be held Saturday afternoon at 2 o'clock with burial in Northumberland Memorial Park, near Stonington.

Pfc. Hoffman was born near Hunter Station in Little Mahanoy Township, November 9, 1922, the son of Mr. and Mrs. William C. Hoffman. In 1939 the family moved to the Sunbury area, their home being along the Sunbury-Shamokin highway, several miles east of the city. He entered the Sunbury High School and was graduated with the class of 1942.

He entered the employ of Westinghouse Electric Corporation at the Sunbury plant where radar was being made. He was called to military service February 26, 1943.

He was trained at Camp Swift, Texas, and took part in military maneuvers in Louisiana, and at Fort Leonard Wood, Mo., where he won a sharpshooters medal.

Assigned to the 175th Regiment of the 29th Infantry Division, he was sent to England in April, 1944, where he received intensive training in tactics for the invasion of Europe.

He participated in the crossing of the English channel to the French coast. In the bitter fighting with the Germans to gain a foothold in Normandy he was slightly wounded June 28, 1944. Recovering quickly he returned to action and was killed July 15 at St. Jean de Baisants.

His body was returned to America on the transport Eric B. Gibson, arriving at Brooklyn Jan. 21 and being transferred from there to the distribution base for Pennsylvania at Philadelphia.

He is survived by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. William C. Hoffman, Sunbury, R. D., his mother being the former Tessie Shaffer. He was the only child of the family. His grandfather, Aaron Shaffer, of this city, also survives.
