RECORD OF EVENTS (CONTINUED)

(9 Jun 44 cont'd) back once by strong counter attack. Reinforced by 120 men from 507th Parachute Infantry and retook the area. Set up a line to hold what we had. Morale good, weather clear.

12 June 1944: Company moved up to forward position. Usual camp duties.

14 June 1944: Company moved forward into Stenaville, encountered strong enemy resistance. After pushing forward approximately 1500 yards was relieved by the 1st Battalion 325th Glider Infantry.

15 June 1944: Toward evening we passed thru the 1st Battalion 325th Glider Infantry to resume the attack. Pushed on to Crosville.
