to forward slope to defense position. No artillery support. Heavy fire came fr La Haye Du Puix.

4 July 44 Patrols sent out all day and night to clear enemy from reverse slope of hill—continued heavy 88 and mortar fire.

5 July 44 Patrol sent out to make recon of hill still occupied by enemy. At 2015 moved out to attack enemy—enemy had strong defense position. 2 assaults made by "F" Co plus 2 tanks. Withdrew and 1 Bn of 507 occupied position and ground we took.

6 July 44 Regt'l reserve area 1300 hr. Set up defensive position. Casualties: 1 O killed in action, 7 EM killed in action, 19 EM & 3 O slightly wounded, 2 EM died of wounds, 1 EM slightly injured. -/o
