

Alec Bong Funeral At Fort Snelling

Funeral services for Pfc. Alec Bong, 30, 427 Clough avenue, who was killed in action January 4, 1945 in the Belgian Bulge during the last war, will be held at Fort Snelling, Minn., Friday at 1:30 p. m. Full military honors will be accorded and interment will be in the Fort Snelling cemetery.

Born in Kanwood, Saskatchewan, Canada, January 4, 1945, he moved to Superior with his parents when one year old and lived in Superior until joining the army in December, 1942. He attended the Cooper and Vocational schools in Superior, and was employed by the Butler and Lake Superior shipyards and the Hill Warehouse in Superior, before entering the service.

At the time of his death he was serving with the Glider Infantry of the 82nd Airborne Division. He had his infantry basic training at Camp Claiborne, La., later went to Fort Meade, Md., and took glider infantry training in England before taking part in the invasion of Holland.

Surviving is a brother, William, of 427 Clough avenue.
