Belgium (Fwd) 29 Jan 45: Went thru the 2nd Bn 325th Gld Inf at 0430. Co "K" 401 took Hleith. "F" & "G" Co 401 went thru town and took high ground about 700 yards in front. Enemy opposition light. Weather still cold, morale fair.
