27 Sep 44 - Co. continued to improve positions, stood by ready to support 28 Bn attack. Sent combat patrol lead by Lt. Einn & Cpl. Gross all returned except Lt. Einn and Pvt. Cleek. Heavy small arms fire on OPL during day. Heavy artillery fire in afternoon. Mark IV tank fired on Co. in afternoon. Co. OP hit, forced to move OP. Cont'd patrolling of Co. front at night. Corrected Artillery on targets to front
