FINDING OF DEATH OF MISSING PERSON

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 5 of the Act of 7 March 1942 (Public Law 490 77th Cong.) as amended, upon direction and delegation by The Secretary of War, The Chief, Casualty Branch, The Adjutant General's Office, finds Corporal Wallace S. Holloman, Army Serial Number 6,968,562, Infantry, to be dead. He was officially reported as missing in action as of the 7th day of June 1944. For the purposes stated in said Act, death is presumed to have occurred on the 8th day of June, 1945.

Proceeding of a Board of Officers appointed in accordance with letter AGAO-S 293.9 (27 Mar 47) D-M, War Dept, TAGO, 9 April 1947.

The Board convened pursuant to par 2, SO 108, Headquarters, 7887 Graves Registration Detachment, APO 757, US Army, 29 August 1950, at Liege, Belgium on 1- SEP 1950. The purpose of the Board was to determine the non-recoverability status of certain casualties now under jurisdiction of this command.

The Board reviewed report of investigation, statements of witnesses and other papers, contained in the files of 7887 Graves Registration Detachment, RA, pertaining to the case of the following named casualty/casualties, the remains of which have not been recovered. The case records and other data considered, are attached.

SYNOPSIS: The casualties listed on attached roster are reported by official records as Missing In Action or Killed In Action during ground air or naval operations in the department of Manche, France, from the period of 5 June 1944 to 15 August 1944. Extensive area searches as well as individual investigations have to date failed to furnish information as to the ultimate disposition of their remains. Efforts to effect association with unidentified recoveries from the area, now interred in U.S. Military Cemeteries, have also proven negative. The lack of specific information regarding the death or burial, limited search in most instances to general localities, however, documents on file in this Office and Office of The Quartermaster General substantiate the fact that numerous investigations covering the entire department of the Manche, have been conducted in the course of search operations for all losses, both recovered and unrecovered. The terrain of the Manche department, for the most part, consists of farm and pasture land which has been under constant cultivation and daily use since the cessation of hostilities, thus the possibility of undiscovered graves is remote. It can therefore only be concluded that the remains of the deceased in question were reduced by battle action to a state which precludes recovery or identification. The absence of specific information concerning their deaths, the failure of Field Investigations to provide evidence, and the lack of association with recovered unknowns would tend to substantiate these

MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD

SUBJECT: Review of Circumstances Surrounding the Disappearance of
Corporal Wallace S. Holloman, 6968562, Infantry

1. Corporal Wallace S. Holloman, 6968562, Infantry, was initially reported seriously injured in action on 6 June 1944, in France, while on jump status, by Casualty Shipment No. 105, ETO, which status was later changed to seriously wounded on 7 June 1944, by Casualty Shipment No. 106, ETO. After numerous letters of inquiry from this office to the Theater, the status of Corporal Holloman was changed to missing in action on 7 June 1944, by Message No. 002100, ETO. He was presumed dead as of 8 June 1945, under the provisions of Section 5, Missing Persons Act.

2. In reply to a letter of inquiry AGPC-S 704, from this office, dated 27 March 1945, the following information was furnished from Headquarters, European Theater of Operations, U.S. Army:

a. Corporal Wallace S. Holloman departed Welford Airbase, England for Hiesville, France 5 June 1944 and was last known to be in the vicinity of Ste Mere Eglise on Cherbourg Peninsula, France. Brief resume of circumstances surrounding disappearance, dated 20 April 1945, is quoted below:

"Seriously injured 6 June 1944 due to prcht. jump on DZ France, Cpl Holloman was left on DZ to be treated by Med Co assigned to service the drop zone. This is the last information available at this Headquarters."

3. A letter, dated 3 October 1944, addressed to Mr. Holloman, father of Corporal Holloman, and signed by Lt Claude D. Wallace, I Co, 501 Pacht, Inf., volunteers the hearsay information that Corporal Holloman suffered a broken leg, that he was attended by an officer and was then evacuated to England by plane. Lt Wallace was, however, unable to locate the hospital to which Corporal Holloman was sent. It is impossible to secure a confirming statement from Lieutenant Wallace because he is in a missing in action status as of 19 December 1944.

4. An examination of the index in Prisoner of War Information Bureau, PWIC, does not reveal any further information relevant to this review. The Captured German Records, now of record in this office, fail to reveal the name of Corporal Holloman. The Quartermaster General's Office, Memorial Division (Mrs. McConaughy) reports that there is no burial report of record in that office, nor any favorable Unknowns that might be associated with him.

5. In the absence of any definite information as to the fate of Corporal Holloman, after he was seriously wounded and left on DZ to be treated by the Medical Company assigned to service the drop zone, it is concluded that the information of record in the Department, at this time, does not warrant the issuance of an official report of death under the provisions of Section 9, Missing Persons Act.

N A R R A T I V E

Investigation of this case resulted in locating the chateau used by the American troops as a hospital during the period 6-9 June 1944.

Mrs. Oetelle residing at the Chateau Colombiere stated that during the period 6-9 June 1944 her home was used as an American hospital and that a total of 235 American soldiers had died and had been buried in a temporary cemetery located on her property.

On 10 July 1944 all the bodies were disinterred from this cemetery and were removed to the Military Cemetery of Bloisville. Later on an American officer came and had all the graves reopened and checked to be sure that all human remains had been removed.

Recommend this case be held until all unknowns at the military cemetery of Bloisville receive a final check.

T R A N S L A T I O N

I the undersigned, Mme COTELLE Anne-Marie, residing at the castle of "COLOMBIERE", at HIESVILLE declare:

My castle has been converted into an american hospital during the night of the 5th to the 6th of June 1944 and has been used till June the 9th.

In this hospital died 185 germans and 255 american soldiers.

These bodies have temporarily been buried in a field and then removed to the cemetery of BLOSVILLE, all together, on about July the 10th 1944.

Later on, american officers came and had the graves opened in order to make sure that the graves had completely been emptied.

All the isolated graves located in the commune have been disinterred and to the best of my knowledge, I presently do not know anyone on the communal territory.

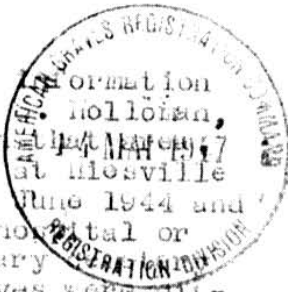

Investigation has been made at Mesville for leading to present burial location of Cpl Wallace G968582, reported wounded in action and missing in action. According to investigation the Chateau Colombiere was used as an American hospital from 6 June to 9 June 1944 and a total of 265 American soldiers who died in the hospital or surrounding area were buried in a temporary military cemetery on the property of the Chateau. All of these graves were disinterred in July 1944 and removed to the US Military Cemetery of Mesville. It is possible that one of the deceased buried here was Cpl Holloman.
