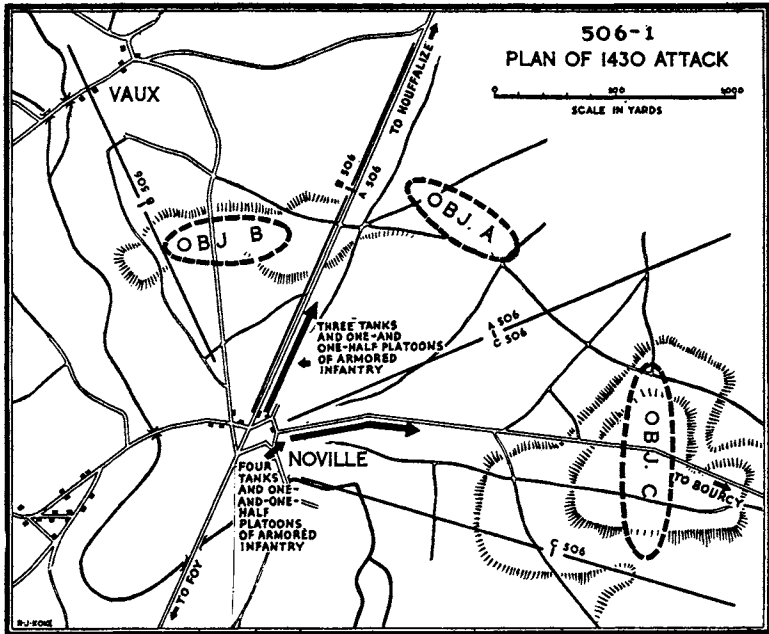

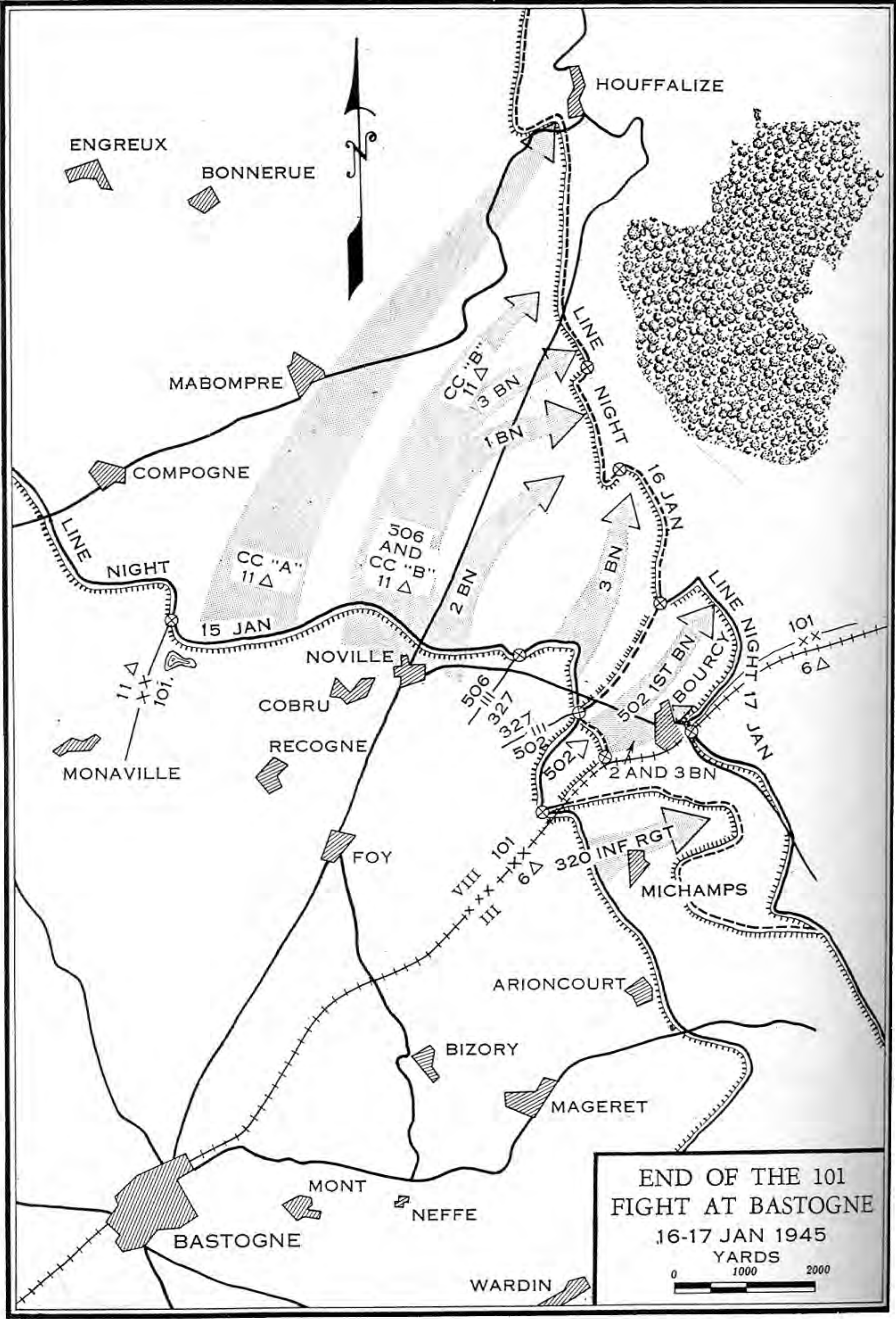

A was blocked by heavy tank fire immediately and after a small advance was forced to return to the village. But on the flanks, B and C went on until they reached the lower slopes of the objective ridges and started to climb. At that moment the enemy tanks came against them, supported by some infantry. A few of the paratroopers kept going; their snow-covered bodies were found on the ridges weeks later.⁶ But the greater part of the two companies went to earth and sought whatever cover was at hand. Then they continued to slug it out with their small arms as best they could. They could hardly see the enemy at any time. The fog was closing down again and it was mixed with the smoke drifting over from the fires of Noville.

They held the ground until dark.⁷ Then Colonel LaPrade's men fell back on Noville. The fighting on the slopes had cost the battalion heavily but the men thought they had caused equal

Pvt. Robert H. Goldbacher, 21, son of Mr. and Mrs. Frank Goldbacher of 28 Pasadena St., Mt. Washington, was killed in action while serving as a paratrooper in Belgium Jan. 15, the War Department revealed. He had been listed as missing since Dec. 19

A graduate of South Hills High School, he worked for the Standard Steel Corp. before entering service Feb. 19, 1943, and went overseas in June.

He is survived by his parents and one brother, Pvt. Frank Goldbacher, with the Air Corps in India.

Funeral services for Pvt. Robert Howard Goldbacher, of 28 Pasadena St., will be held there at 2 p. m. Thursday.

Pvt. Goldbacher, 22, was killed in action in Belgium, Jan. 15, 1945. He served with Co. C, 101st Airborne Division. At the time he joined the service on Dec. 19, 1943, he was employed by the Standard Steel Co.

He attended the Beltzhoover and South Hills High schools and was a member of the First St. Paul's Evangelical Lutheran Church.

The son of Frank and Mary Paster Goldbacher, he also is survived by a brother, Frank J.

Burial will be in St. Paul's Cemetery.
