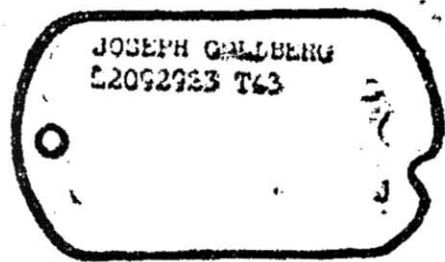

Receipted bills are not required to accompany this form. Any expenses over and above the \$75 maximum must be borne by the person who incurred or paid the additional expenses.

However, the amount which you may be allowed (the difference between cost of delivery to you and cost of delivery by the government direct to the national or post cemetery) may not exceed the amount actually expended by you to deliver the remains to the cemetery grave site. WHETHER OR NOT YOU WILL BE GRANTED AN ALLOWANCE IS DEPENDENT UPON AN AUDIT OF THIS REQUEST. IN ANY EVENT YOU WILL BE NOTIFIED OF ANY ALLOWANCE DUE YOU BY THE OFFICE TO WHICH THIS FORM IS SENT.
3. Reimbursement by the government will be made only to the person who paid from his personal funds for transporting the remains to the national or post cemetery grave site.
4. No interment expense allowance is authorized since interment is made ultimately in a national or post cemetery.

Acknowledgment is made of your letter of 14 December 1944 regarding the incorrect information which this office had forwarded to you concerning Joseph Goldberg.

Upon examination of the records, it has been found that the information in my letter of 21 November 1944 was taken from the records of another Joseph Goldberg, also a casualty. It is regretted that this erroneous information was transmitted to you.

The official report of interment which has been received shows that the remains of your husband, Private Joseph Goldberg 12092923, were reverently and properly interred in the American Cemetery, Bloisville, France; Plot D, Row 4, Grave 70. A Hebrew service was conducted at the grave by an Army Chaplain. A temporary marker, with a fitting inscription thereon, has been erected and the grave properly recorded. The cemetery is well cared for as it is under the immediate supervision of our military authorities.

As stated in our earlier letter, a notation has been made on the official records of this office that it is your desire to have your husband's body returned, if possible, to the United States for final interment after the war. At the proper time the legal next of kin will be requested to advise this office of the desired place of final shipment. Steps will then be taken to prepare and ship the remains at Government expense to the place thus designated.

May I again express my regret that this error occurred and extend to you my sincere sympathy in the loss of your husband.

Will you please complete the enclosed form, "Request for Disposition of Remains" and mail in the enclosed self-addressed envelope, which requires no postage, within 30 days after its receipt by you? Its prompt return will avoid unnecessary delays.
