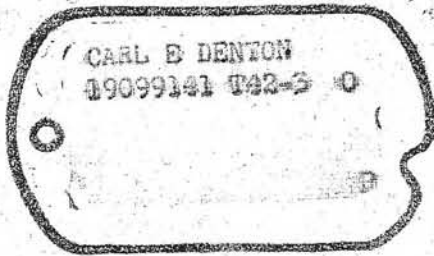

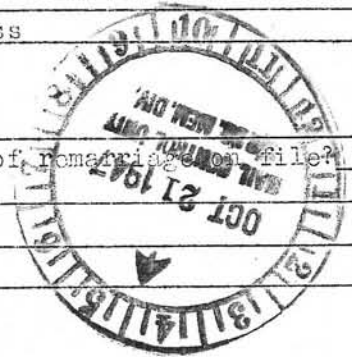


Your letter of January 12, 1948, regarding above captioned, addressed to San Francisco and forwarded here,----


