Following is a statement of George E. Colli dated 22 January 1946 concerning the disappearance of Major Johnston (file AG 201 Johnston, Charles D.):

"On D-Day, Major Johnston jumped with his Battalion Readquarters Company 3rd Battalion. As you may have been informed, a few planes of ours landed around twenty-two miles from our D-Z. Major johnston was among us. The place we landed was a small town called Graines. France, around six miles south of Carenton. On the night of June izer we were attacked by a large number of the enemy, and we were all forced to split up in small groups. was along with Major Johnston, also two other officers and another enlisted man. Major Johnston wanted to cross a bridge so he could contact some friendly forces. We were fark informed of the bridge being guarded by S. S. Troopers, but he insisted we cross the bridge anyway. We walked through the back of some woods and came upon the road leading to the bridge. So we kept in single file and stayed on the road. At the curve just before the bridge. some guards jumped out and halted us, and being swampland on both sides of the road, we all jumped in. I saw around three guards some running down the bank and shooting about that time one of the officers kx was hit, so Major Johnston was trying to have them stop shooting by offering to surrender, and when they heard him they turned all their guns in his direction and another officer, Lieutenant Maxwell was shot through the stomach I believe. Finally I saw them call Major Johnston up to the bank followed by another man, which I thought may be the other enlisted man. I dicked under water and pulled myself quite away before I came up, and that's all I can tell you."

An examination of the files of the subject officer in Casualty Branch and Officers Branch, AGO, and the index in Prisoner of War Information Bureau, PMGO, does not reveal any further information relevant to this review.

MARRATIVE

On 20 November 1946 at approximately 1500 hrs I went to the "Village de la Varde to disinter a body reported by the mairie of Murchesieux, who was informed by Mr. Binard of the village "de la Varde". I found the remains lying in an irrigation canal, approximately 600 yds NE of the above named village, and about 5 yards on the north side of route D 59. The body was marked by a small wooden cross with no inscription. on it. The cross was about 6 inches on the north side of the body which was submerged. Between the cross and the body I found a wallet containing a NAGO Form 65-1, which had the following number on it: 53960.

The body was lying with the feet towards the road, and was still

clothed, although the clothing was decomposed.

I spoke with Mr. Binard who said he found the body about 15 days ago, while working in the field, and notified the mayor of Marchesieux. Mr. Binard also was the person who placed the cross, he adds that he could find no means of identification.

1, the undersigned, BINARD Jules, a farmer living at the village La Varde certify that about 15 days ago, when working in a field lining the road to CARENTAN, 1 found the body of an American soldier.

A few paratroopers were shot down over this hamlet. I believed that the body I found in a field fifteen days ago, and which was removed yesterday 20th November 1946 by American authorities was also a member of paratroopers regiments.


In reference to this American body, 1 certify that 1 have not found any identification tags or other papers susceptible of giving his identity.

l found this body myself and 1 immediately advised the Mayor of the community of MARCHESIEUX.1 also placed the cross which was on the grave.





- 1. On November 20, 1946, Lt. Westover went to village de la Varde, Hanche, France, where he disinterred the body of an American soldier. The body was reported by Mr. Binard of the village de la Varde to the Mairie of Marchesieux who in turn reported it to A.G.R.C.
- 2. It. Westover contacted Mr. Binard who stated he found the body about 15 days before in an irrigation ditch while he was working in his field. Mr. Binard was unable to find any identification as to the name of the soldier, so he put up a wooden cross.
- 3. It. Westover did find a wallet with an WAGO Form 65 1 with the following number on it 53960. It. Westover turned over the remains to the C.I.P. in Carentan, France.



- 1. The investigation of the case of Major Charles D. Johnston (Manche 5066) is completed with the following results:
- a. In Graignes (T-47 Cherbourg & Caen 3A&8, 1:250,000) we located a Mrs Boursier who fed the paratroop unit of which Major Johnston was in command. She saw Major Johnston taken away alive and a prisoner of the German SS Troops on the morning of 12 June 1944.
- b. The prisoners, 9 in all, were seen by various persons being marched down the road toward Mesnil Angot(same Coordinates), About 10 days later 22 June 1944 9 bodies of American paratroops were found on a farm in Mesnil Angot, and these were removed sometime between the 30 June and 4 August 1944 as certified to by the Mayor, Mr. Jean POULLAIN.
- c. No one was found who could certify if one of the 9 remains mentioned above was an American officer. Every indication is however, that he was one of the 9 prisoners taken back by the German SS troops and killed after the fighting was over.
- 2. It is recommended that on the basis of the attached statements that this case be turned over for further investigation by the War Crimes Commission.
