My action in transmitting the property does not, of itself, vest title in you. The items are forwarded in order that you may act as gratuitous bailee in caring for them pending the return of the owner, who has been reported missing in action. In the event he later is reported a casualty, and I sincerely hope he never is, it will be necessary that the property be turned over to the person or persons legally entitled to receive it.

Dear Mrs. Premo:

This is in reply to your recent letter regarding your husband, Private First Class Harold J. Premo.

The distress you have suffered since you received the sad announcement of your husband's death and your desire to know the attending circumstances is most understandable. The official report received in this office states that he was killed in action on 6 June 1944 in France, the date he had previously been reported missing in action. I regret that no subsequent details have been received in the War Department to date.

A copy of your letter has been forwarded to the Quartermaster General, Washington 25, D. C., for direct reply to you, as that official has jurisdiction over matters pertaining to personal effects and identification tags.

Your feeling that Private Premo is the one appearing in the picture which you forwarded to this office is appreciated; however, no information is available as to the name of the individual in question. Permit me to explain that the War Department has investigated the possibility of making positive identification of the subjects of photographs of this nature. It has been found that any identification is largely one of opinion with multiple identifications of each subject of such a picture. This has been often known to be true even in cases where pictures are taken and developed under ideal conditions. In no cases do our repatriated personnel remain unknown since through comparison of fingerprints and other positive means their identity is established, the responsible authority notified as to the person's name and serial number, a report rendered promptly to the War Department and the family involved notified without delay as to the change in his status.

I fully realize there is little I can say to mitigate your grief or relieve your sorrow but I cannot refrain from tendering my

Your letter to The Adjutant General concerning your husband, the late Private First Class Harold J. Premo, has been referred to this office.

The official Report of Burial discloses that the remains of your husband were interred in Plot Y, Row 9, Grave 162, in the U. S. Military Cemetery, Blossville, France, located approximately twenty miles northwest of St. Lo, twenty-four miles southeast of Cherbourg and five miles north and slightly west of Carentan, all in France.

The identification tags are considered part of the uniform worn by military personnel and in case of death, one tag is buried with the remains and the other attached to the grave marker at the time of interment for future identification.

There are no provisions at the present time whereby the War Department may furnish photographs of military cemeteries or of individual graves overseas. However, it is anticipated that, within the current calendar year, the War Department, through the Headquarters, Army Air Forces, will be able to provide, upon request of the next of kin, air photographs of most of the principal established military cemeteries overseas.

Please accept my sincere sympathy in the loss of your husband.

Will you please complete the enclosed form, "Request for Disposition of Remains" and mail in the enclosed self-addressed envelope, which requires no postage, within 30 days after its receipt by you? Its prompt return will avoid unnecessary delays.

This is to inform you that the remains of your loved one have been permanently interred, as recorded above, side by side with comrades who also gave their lives for their country. Customary military funeral services were conducted over the grave at the time of burial.

After the Department of the Army has completed all final interments, the cemetery will be transferred, as authorized by the Congress, to the care and supervision of the American Battle Monuments Commission. The Commission also will have the responsibility for permanent construction and beautification of the cemetery, including erection of the permanent headstone. The headstone will be inscribed with the name exactly as recorded above, the rank or rating where appropriate, organization, State, and date of death. Any inquiries relative to the type of headstone or the spelling of the name to be inscribed thereon, should be addressed to the American Battle Monuments Commission, Washington 25, D. C. Your letter should include the full name, rank, serial number, grave location, and name of the cemetery.

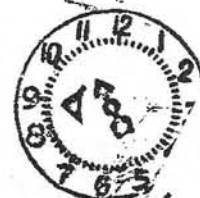
