SYNOPSIS: The casualties listed on attached roster are report by official records as Missing In Action or Killed In Action during grou air or naval operations in the department of Manche, France, from the period of 5 June 1944 to 15 August 1944. Extensive area searches as wel. as individual investigations have to date failed to furnish information as to the ultimate disposition of their remains. Efforts to effect association with unidentified recoveries from the area, now interred in U.S. Military Cemeteries, have also proven negative. The lack of specifi information regarding the death or burial, limited search in most instances to general localities, however, documents on file in this Offic and Office of The Quartermaster General substantiate the fact that numerous investigations covering the entire department of the Manche, have been conducted in the course of search operations for all losses, both recovered and unrecovered. The terrain of the Manche department, for the most part, consists of farm and pasture land which has been under constant cultivation and daily use since the cessation of hostilities, thus the possibility of undiscovered graves is remote. It can therefore only be concluded that the remains of the deceased in question were reduced by battle action to a state which precludes recovery or identification. The absence of specific information concerning their deaths, the failure of Field Investigations to provide evidence, and the lack of association with recovered unknowns would tend to substantiate these



Investigation at Graignes, department of Manche, where S/Sgt Hornbaker is reported to have landed after parachute jump, failed to furnish any information on his present burial location. At present the inhabitants of this area have no further knowledge of isolated graves in the vicinity. Although the people at Graignes and the nearby village of Menil Angot did see bodies of American deceased after the Hivasion all of these bodies were removed by unidentified American units in July 1944.

On June 6, I saw the American paratrooper D. J. Wellis member of the 507 PAR CCHF Inf. Hq Co.. The American troops stationed here from the 6 to 11 of june. At this date there had a fighting between American and Germans, the Americans were obliged to retreat toward Carentan in the night of 11 to 12 June.

I have no knowledge of soldiers having parachuted in the community on 8 and 11 june.

On 12 June, I was prisoner of the Germans, I saw 11 American prisoners, the Germans took them at Mesnil Angot and killed them.

They were removed by American authority and buried at Blosville.

I know that 5 bodies were removed from the pool located at Mes Boursier's farm.

On June 11, 1944 the Germans shot 5 American paratroopers in a field, near our farm. An interpreter who was working with the American troops said that he heard the German officer giving the order to shot them. Then, they throw them in the pool located in our farm. the grave digger Mr Lenormand, and the Mayor Mr Vodis removed 5 bodies from that pool, but the Germans did not permit to bury them in the cemetery. They digged a hole and they put the 5 bodies in it. At the beginning of August 1944 the American troops removed these bodies.

In the night of 11-12 june the Germans burned several bodies in a field located near the farm, in April 1945 officers came on investigation, and went on the place where the bodies were burnt, and they say that they recognized human bones.




