2. T/Sgt. Herbert C. Neumayer, 17042525, Grew Chief and 3/Sgt. Merrill E. Levy, 35429678, Radio Operator reported this organization on 12 June 1944. The aforementioned aircraft was sit by enemy gunfire after mission accomplished. The aircraft's left engine enveloped in flame and having received the order to abandom aircraft, Neumayer and Levy parachuted to safety in enemy held territory at approximately 0240 hours on 5 June 1944 from an altitude of over 2000 feet. They testify no other parachutes were seen as aircraft veered to the left as though automatic pilot intact. Immediately upon their landing, the aircraft was heard to crash and explode. No further information on pilot and co-pilot has been received.


