



1. Statement by 1st Lt. George D. Lamm, O1287020 is forwarded your
headquarters giving information pertaining to aircraft number 42-92868
which is carried on Theatre records as missing in action, 6 June 1944.

Aircraft No. 42-92868 was my carrier in the operation of 6 June
1944. All the paratroopers in the plane jumped at hr. 0230, 6 June 1944
about 1500 yards west of St. Mere Eglise, France. This was the last seen
of the aircraft and when last seen it was receiving small arms fire how-
ever it did not seem to be in any trouble. It was flying in a westerly
direction in the direction we had come in. The plane had received some
anti-aircraft and small arms fire when we hit landfall coming in from the
west on course to D.Z. however it had no noticeable effect at the time. We
had missed the D.Z. so flew towards the Past coast and then turned and
came back on course to D.Z. in a westerly direct on. As we jumped we got
some small arms fire but until the last man left the plane it had no
effect. The last man out saw it headed west back the way we came in and
it seemed to operating proper. I can't give any other information of value
except when we jumped all the crew members where un-injured and there was
no sign of anything wrong with the aircraft.
